Biographical Information for Michael J. Taylor,
Educator, Performer, Student, Entrepreneur, Composer, Recording Artist, Writer

General synopsis:	Whether it is as an educator, entrepreneur, video/recording artist or performer, Taylor brings a unique perspective to his craft. With the combination of a unique ability to communicate, instill discipline and promote creativity, combined with a broad range of life and professional experience, he focuses on the relationship between the individual and rhythm/drumming. This has led to an overall philosophy that seeks to bridge the gap between all things in rhythm, seeking to find where ones own personal pulse lies in relation to the collective pulse. By way of traditional West African or non-traditional styles, Taylor demonstrates the universality of rhythm in everything he does.
Teaching:	Taylor brings a unique perspective to his teachings. As a Tam Tam Mandingue Certified Professor , he teaches traditional West African rhythms as well as traditional djembe technique, rhythm exercises and listening skills. Students are encouraged to explore the far-reaching implications of learning rhythm on how they think, their level of personal confidence, how they feel and how they reason. The learning of rhythm can be a conduit to understanding the importance of independence/interdependence. Learning your part achieves independence; putting that part in the context of others' achieves interdependence.
Workshops:	In his workshop program 'Ordered Chaos', he expresses his reverence to the balance between order and chaos in a philosophical light; he shows the balance between order and chaos as that which binds and separates the universe - the entire universe is in rhythm. He demonstrates this balance through various rhythmic/arhythmic exercises along with exploring the importance of technique in finding ones individual voice on the drum. Additionally, in the second half of the program, he teaches a traditional West African djembe rhythm, so that participants get a taste of the traditional side of the type of drumming he specializes in.
Work with youth:	In his work with children, he has seen how drumming can enliven and educate on a number of different levels. Qualities like discipline, patience, focus and determination translate into reward, community and "positivity" when children drum. 'It is fascinating seeing kids understand what it is to <i>understand</i> on a deeper level than they are accustomed to', states Taylor, 'by this I mean not only understanding and mastering the pieces of the puzzle, the parts, but fitting them together, making one rhythm, one puzzle, where everyone has a role in the whole.'
Work special needs groups:	In his work with the mentally and physically challenged, he has seen how drumming can bring out the abilities of mentally and physically challenged adults and children. Percussion is such a primal thing; it's appeal is on a very deep level in the human psyche. 'I have seen communication/bonding [by way of percussion] on a level with the handicapped that most of them were not able to explore in any other mode of communication', quotes Taylor.
Performances:	In his performances Taylor strives to translate rhythm into a variety of contexts, both traditional and non-traditional. In the traditional and non-traditional form performing West African djembe rhythms with performance ensemble with HOLY GOAT ENSEMBLE, he has combined his djembe stylings with poetry, voice, acoustic combos and ensembles, full bands, traditional combos and ensembles, performance art, etc. He aspires to combine theatre with rhythm, including lighting, costuming, scripting, etc.
Recording/ Video:	Taylor's most recent DVD project is an instructional DVD, focused on the practice of djembe rhythms of the Mande, entitled, "Akarán Iko Iko (learn again, again)" ©2006. His first DVD project focused on traditional djembe technique, and is entitled "Remembering How To Drum" ©2003. These ground breaking DVDs utilize cutting-edge DVD technology in presenting what he thinks any serious student of the djembe needs to focus on. As a recording artist, Taylor uses traditional instrumentation to translate his rhythmic ideas onto a recordable medium. His third CD, "SILENCE IN THE RHYTHMIC SOUP – RHYTHMIC ENVIRONMENTS FOR YOGA AND MEDITATION" ©2003 was created for use with Yoga and meditation. His second CD, 'SILENCE' ©2001, is his first solo work which he composed, arranged, produced and recorded. His first compact disc 'A TOUCH OF CHAOS IN THE RHYTHMIC SOUP' ©1996 was a collaborative effort between Taylor and his long-time partner in creative-crime, writer, producer, engineer, teacher, performer, Christian Pawola. Writings:	Taylor has written several pieces, all in some way tied to the drum experience as metaphor for larger experiences that all humanity shares. His works have been commissioned by WBEZ (Chicago's NPR affiliate) Piece 1 on WBEZ , Piece 2 on WBEZ , for World Percussion Rhythm Magazine and appear on his website. He is currently working on a book of African short stories.
